Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you are enjoying looking at all the children's learning on Tapestry. We love capturing them working hard and sharing their learning with you. Please feel free to make comments and like our posts.

As part of celebrating the diversity of our community and our Religious Education curriculum, we have been teaching the children about Diwali - a festival celebrating the triumph of light over darkness enjoyed by millions of people of Hindu, Sikh and Jain faiths. The word Diwali comes from the Sanskrit word Deepavali, which means "rows of lighted lamps".

We were thrilled to welcome some special visitors into school this week. Kushi and Aadit's mum spoke to Year 2 and 4 about how her family prepare for and celebrate this special occasion. Mrs Doshi explained several traditions to the children and created mehndi patterns with henna. She explained how homes are cleaned and new clothes are worn. Outside their homes, people draw rangolis - traditional designs made using colourful powders - to bring good luck and positivity into their lives.



Musicians from the South Asian Arts UK also visited school and played some traditional Indian music. The children listened intently and really enjoyed hearing the sitar and tabla drums.

Next week, we will be discussing your child's progress, setting targets for the year and giving

As part of these evenings, we would also like to consult parents and carers regarding our Relationships, Sex and Health Education curriculum (RSE) which is part of Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE).

In 2020, we reviewed the RSE policy, sharing the themes, lessons and vocabulary with parents to get their feedback on what was being taught. We would like to do this again as we now have lots of new families. During Parents evenings, there will be a display of books, resources and copies of our current curriculum and policy for you to look at. ## OFSTED update

As you may know, when we became an academy with Red Kite Learning Trust, we effectively became a new school. Colton was last inspected in 2012 and gained the outstanding grade under the old framework and criteria. We are very proud of our school, and we have a very strong curriculum offer for our children. Ofsted will still consider many of the same things such as safeguarding, behaviour and attitudes of the children (which includes attendance) but many aspects of the framework are new. We still feel our school offers a fantastic education – both academically and personally for our children. Our 'Curriculum for Life' is carefully designed to offer a wide range of subjects and

experiences. We want everyone to be successful at school. Whenever we get 'the call,' we hope you will join us in celebrating how fantastic Colton Primary school is.

Most of our children love coming to school and attend really well, meeting our attendance target of 97% or above by the end of the year. We have a duty to inform families who are at risk of their child becoming persistently absent – where attendance has fallen below 90%. There is a clear link between attendance at school and academic performance and we naturally want the very best for all our pupils. If you would like any help or support with attendance, please speak to your class teacher, Mrs. Beard or Mrs. Johnson. This week, the Attendance Shield went to Year 5 with 99.62%.
