1. HIGH QUALITY TEACHING

To ensure access to high quality teaching, we will use:

Early Reading

- RWinc programme to train all staff and ensure consistency
- Phonics lead (supported by RWinc programme) monitors all staff are teaching to a high standard

Music

- Music specialist to teach structured weekly music lessons from Nursery to Y6 and whole class instrument lessons (KS2) as the research shows a positive impact on brain development
- Well-planned music curriculum written by music specialist to ensure children are exposed to a broad range of genres and experiences to gain an appreciation of the arts

2. TARGETED ACADEMIC SUPPORT

To deliver impactful targeted support, we will use:

- Lexia programme and Dynamo maths: bespoke personalised learning to those vulnerable to under achievement in reading
- 1:1 tuition in Spring / Summer term in English and Maths (delivered inhouse as we found this was more impactful)
- Additional teacher to support class with high proportion of disadvantaged pupils delivering bespoke interventions to ensure accelerated progress
- Disadvantaged pupils to access additional teaching hours in class

EYFS

 EYFS staff developing their communication and language approaches by working closely with SALT to implement assess and deliver quality S&L interventions (including Early Talk Boost)

3. WIDER STRATEGIES

Remove non-academic barriers to attainment by:

- Establishing nurture sessions run by the learning mentor and DH for targeted pupils to ensure access to learning and promote attendance of disadvantaged pupils
- Making links with parents and carers to support anxiety and promote good attendance
- Subsidised enrichment, such as: educational visits, after school clubs, holiday clubs and opportunities for extra music tuition
- Access to a full school uniform
- Strengthen links with Temple
 Newsam Colton Children's Centre to make connections with more
 vulnerable families at an earlier stage
- Give disadvantaged pupils access to experiences and opportunities in and out of school (such as: live music performances)

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
