When your child joins Colton Primary School you can be reassured that the future strength and success of our school is further assured by being part of a strong, effective and successful Trust.





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
Welcome to Colton Primary School

About our school





Colton Primary is a one-form entry school with a 26-place nursery.

We have a breakfast and after school club every day on-site, run by dedicated members of our staff team, ensuring that children have a safe and welcoming space to start and finish their school day.

In addition to our traditional classrooms, we have dedicated learning spaces designed to enhance our curriculum. Our Art Room, complete with a cooking space, allows pupils to explore their creativity. The Learning Hub is home to our school library and a computer zone, providing pupils with access to a wealth of knowledge. For those in need of a guiet and soothing environment, our Rainbow Room offers a calm and sensory space.

Outside, our large playground and field provide ample opportunities for physical activities and free play. We also have a pond, a sensory garden and a woodland area known as 'Windmill Woods', where pupils can immerse themselves in nature. To further enhance outdoor learning, we have a trained Forest Schools Teacher who works with children across the school.

We are proud to offer a range of after-school clubs to meet the diverse interests of our pupils. From gymnastics and yoga to choir, board games and drawing club, there is something for everyone. These extracurricular activities provide opportunities for pupils to explore their passions and develop new skills.

In association with local partners and support services, such as the Temple Newsam Community Partnership and the Temple Newsam and Colton Children's Centre, we ensure that families have access to the support they need. We prioritise providing children with the very best start from birth to five, building strong foundations for their future learning and development.

The school gates open 15 minutes before school starts and ends. Children are collected from the playground by their Class Teacher in the morning and dismissed to parents in the playground at the end of the day. Please let the Class Teacher or school office know if someone else will be picking up your child, as we will ask for a password before handing them over.

Our School Uniform

At Colton Primary School, we have high standards and wear our uniform with pride.

Our uniform is:

- Navy blue jumper or cardigan (Logos not essential)
- Dark grey trousers or dark grey trouser shorts (no casual shorts)
- Dark grey skirt or pinafore dress or blue gingham dress (in summer)
- White polo shirt
- Plain grey, black or dark blue tights or plain white, black or grey socks
- ▶ Black shoes/short boots/plain black trainers

For PE children should wear

- Navy plain PE shorts
- ► White T shirt (no buttons or accessories) either plain or with the Colton star on
- For outdoors: sturdy trainers, plain navy tracksuit top and bottoms.
- Long hair must be tied back and no jewellery can be worn for PE sessions (including earrings)

Dress Code

Shirts/Blouses:

All shirts and blouses should be tucked in to maintain a smart appearance.

Hair:

Hair should be neatly styled, with no extreme haircuts or shaved patterns. Hair length must be at least a grade 2. Long hair should be tied back.

Hair Accessories:

Small, discreet hair accessories in navy, grey, black, or white school colours are allowed to keep hairstyles subtle and in line with our guidelines.

Nail Varnish and Makeup:

Regular day-to-day wearing of nail varnish and makeup is not permitted. However, on special occasions like PTA dress down day and charity fancy dress days, face paints may be allowed for specific purposes (e.g. dots for Pudsey Bear).

Jewellery:

No jewellery apart from a watch, which should be removed during physical education (P.E.) classes. A single pair of stud earrings is allowed, but these must also be removed during P.E.

By following these guidelines, our children develop pride, responsibility, and discipline. We aim to create a harmonious environment where all pupils can focus on learning without distractions.

We appreciate the support of parents/carers in ensuring that these guidelines are followed.

Attendance

Colton Primary School promotes excellent attendance and aims to raise attainment levels and engagement by continuing to have high levels of attendance from Nursery through to Year 6. We know that levels of attainment are linked to attendance and this can only be achieved through a strong relationship between school, parents and carers. Academic and social achievement depends on a regular attendance in school and we work closely with families to achieve this. Our school has an attendance target of at least 97%.



Please note, holidays in term time will not be authorised.



School Meals

Children have a choice of having either a packed lunch from home or one of our freshly cooked meals. Our food provider is Hutchisons who prepare meals on site daily. Options include a hot main meal or vegetarian option, jacket potatoes or a sandwich.

A well-stocked salad bar is also available each day. Children will also get a pudding or fruit with their meal. Children with special dietary requirements around allergies and food tolerances are well catered for by Hutchisons.

Our breakfast club operates from 7:30 am every morning, while our after-school club offers care until 6:00 pm. At Colton Kid's Club, we create a secure, engaging, and, most importantly, enjoyable environment for children aged 3 to 11 years. Our team of qualified and experienced play workers fully understand the importance of play in meeting the individual developmental needs of children. Colton Kid's Club is a welcoming space that is committed to providing equal opportunities for all children.

Home School Communication

At Colton, we believe that excellent home-school communication is crucial. We aim to foster a collaborative relationship with parents, ensuring that they are actively involved in their child's education. We work together to provide the best possible education for our children.

We use the Tapestry and Showbie apps which can be accessed on any device.

Tapestry is our main communication tool. Through Tapestry, parents can access and interact with their child's learning journey. They can view and comment on photos, videos, and observations, as well as share their child's learning and experiences from home with us.





Tapestry also allows us to send important updates, and messages to parents. Please check this regularly.

Showbie is used in Key Stage 2 (year 3 to year 6) to store and share pupil's learning across the curriculum.

Early Years at Colton



We take great pride in the excellent quality of our Early Years provision at Colton. Our experienced, dedicated staff are passionate about providing children with a high-quality learning experience throughout the Foundation stage.

Our goal at Colton is to nurture confident, resilient, and independent learners. We aim to create vibrant and engaging learning experiences that bring joy to children and foster their curiosity to learn even more.

Our curriculum and child-led approach ensure that all children thrive, regardless of their abilities or needs. It is an exciting and interactive play-based learning journey that offers purposeful opportunities for children to explore their own interests and fascinations.



Early Years Curriculum

Our Nursery and Reception children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum which is made up of key areas of learning. These include 3 Prime Areas which are Communication and Language, Physical Development, and Personal, Social and Emotional Development. In addition, children also develop skills in Literacy, Maths, Understanding of the World and Expressive arts and design. This is done through hands-on activities and within small group sessions.

Interacting with young children is central to our daily practice and a crucial part of our teaching and learning approach within Early Years. We recognise the profound importance of these interactions in supporting and expanding children's learning. Play is at the core of everything we do. We highly value the learning environment as a means for children to develop their curiosity, independence, and resilience.

Early Years at Colton





Early Reading

Reading and books play a vital role in the development of children's language skills. In our Early Years curriculum, we prioritise language development through the integration of stories, songs, and rhymes. This emphasis on oracy, vocabulary, and storytelling is essential for our pupils. To enhance language skills, we have increased our focus on speaking, listening, language, and rhymes.

At our school, we have adopted Read Write Inc (RWI) as our phonics and reading scheme. This program equips children with the ability to read and identify sounds. Through RWI, our pupils learn to read accurately, fluently, and with understanding, allowing them to spell and write their own compositions. Tailored RWI sessions are conducted daily alongside sessions that encourage writing for pleasure.

Transition to Colton Primary School

- At Colton Primary School, we want your child's transition into Nursery and Reception to be smooth, supportive and successful.
- ▶ We hold a welcome meeting for our new parents and carers in the summer term before our children start. This also incorporates home visits, so our Early Years Team can get to know our children in a familiar environment.
- ▶ We offer stay and play sessions at the start of the new term where your child will have chance to explore our early years classrooms at their own pace.
- ▶ We look forward to welcoming all our new children and integrating them into school life. We believe in nurturing strong and happy relationships between home and school. This ensures a successful start to your child's educational journey here at Colton Primary.




Colton's Curriculum for Life prepares children for the future...

Red Kite Learning Trust is the Admission Authority for all our Trust schools and works in partnership with Leeds City Council to administer the school application process fairly and effectively.

Applying for a Place in Reception

- The national deadline for application for September 2026 Reception places is 15 January 2026
- To apply you need to complete the Leeds City Council (LCC) online form which you can find here: www.leeds.gov.uk/schools-and-education/school-admissions
- It is important that you read the 2026/27 admissions policies for the schools of interest to you. These can be found on each individual school website. Ours can be found here: www.colton.org.uk/admissions
- Please ensure you provide any extra information that is relevant to support your application, as detailed in the 2026/27 admissions policy for Colton Primary School.

A Quick Guide Admissions



- lt is recommended to name 5 preferred schools on your application form
- Living in the catchment area does not guarantee a place at a school
- Your child's or a sibling's attendance at the nursery at Colton Primary School is not a priority group for admission and does not secure an offer of a Reception place
- If you require help with completing your application form, contact LCC by calling **0113 222 4414** or e-mailing **startingprimary@leeds.gov.uk**
- If you are applying to a school from outside Leeds, you must submit your application via your own local authority, instead of via LCC
- Inform your local authority of any changes to your circumstances as soon as possible (for example, if you are moving house)
- Places will be offered in writing by LCC on National Offer Day which is 16 April 2026
- You will be offered a place at your highest preference school, for which your application meets the school's admissions policy priority criteria

How your Application is Processed

Whilst Red Kite Learning Trust is the admission authority for its schools, Leeds City Council (LCC) as the local authority, have a duty to administer the admissions process on the Trust's behalf. Applications and offers for school places are co-ordinated by LCC in line with the selection criteria set out in each school policy.

Applications for places are ranked in priority order when a school is oversubscribed. For Colton Primary School, the criteria are as follows:

After the admission of pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming the school



- 1. Looked after children and all previously looked after children
- 2. Children without an EHCP but who have special educational needs, or with exceptional medical, mobility or social needs, which can only be met at the school
- 3. Children with a sibling who is on the school admission register on National Offer Day and is living at the same address
- 4. Children who have a parent or carer employed by Red Kite Learning Trust as an established staff team member within the school at the time of application
- 5. Children living in the catchment area of the school
- 6. Any other children, by distance from the school

Supporting the Wider Education Community

Colton Primary School is committed to train and develop school colleagues at every stage of their careers, from initial teacher training through to a full range of school leadership programmes. Our pupils benefit from this wider work as it impacts directly on the quality of teaching they receive.

Red Kite Education

Red Kite Education is a team of experienced and talented colleagues who lead and support Red Kite Alliance, Red Kite Teacher Training and Red Kite Teaching School Hub, serving a community of schools who work across all these strands. Colton Primary School is an active member of this community.



Red Kite Alliance is a partnership of over 50 schools working collaboratively to be 'stronger together'. Colton Primary School attends 22 Primary Subject Network Meetings a year, as well as Headteacher briefings and Primary Leaders meetings. In total there have been 58 in-person events and 64 online events with the Alliance in the past academic year.

Red Kite Teacher Training is one of the largest school centred initial teacher training providers in the country and Red Kite Teaching School Hub is one of 87 Teaching School Hubs nationally supporting teacher development.



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
