Dear Parents and Carers,

What a fabulous year! I am so proud of all the children and staff for their hard work and dedication to learning. Our children have done brilliantly and made superb progress. As an inclusive school, we are unlikely to top the league tables, but we all strive to ensure every pupil achieves their very best.

This year, our results in national tests are as follows:

Reception children: 70% achieved a 'Good Level of Development'

Year 1: 77% passed their Phonics Screening Check

Year 4: 67% received full marks or 24/25 in their Multiplication Screening Check

Year 6: 67% achieved the 'Age Related Expectation' in reading and 13% achieved the higher standard 67% achieved the 'Age Related Expectation' in writing and 17% achieved the higher standard 73% achieved the 'Age Related Expectation' in maths and 23% achieved the higher standard 77% achieved the 'Age Related Expectation' in grammar and spelling and 27% achieved the higher standard

Our year 6 pupils have excelled in their end of term performance, and I fully expect to see some of them on the television or on stage! We work closely with all the high schools to make sure that the transition from year 6 to year 7 goes as smoothly as possible. It is a big change, but the children are more than ready for the next step in their educational journey. Everyone at Colton wishes them all the very best as they move on to high school.

Our Curriculum for Life continues to offer the children exciting, real life learning experiences. We have enjoyed lots of performances, productions, live music, school visits and sports. Tapestry is full of happy children, engrossed in their learning – it is just joyful. We have more exciting plans for next year too. Please see the 2024-25 calendar of events for details.

Every parent is a member of our PTA, and we are very grateful for everyone's support. Whether you are an active member, planning and organising the summer fair, a disco, a pop-up shop, or you support the PTA events – thank you. With very challenging budgets and no sign of this improving, we rely more than ever on the PTA to fund things that make enhance the children's time with us at Colton.

I would also like to thank the Governors for all their help, support and challenge over this year. I am absolutely thrilled with our Ofsted outcome. It is extremely rare for a school to be judged outstanding in all areas and the report is a testament to everyone's dedication and commitment to the school. So once again, thank you.

Colton Kids Club

Looking forward to September, there are a couple of bits of information to share.

We have tried really hard not to increase the prices of school lunches but can no longer subsidise meals for the children. From September, the **new prices for school lunches are Nursery £2.65 and KS2 £2.85**. All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 can have a free school dinner.

School Uniform

When we return to school in September, we will be monitoring school uniform. There is no requirement to have uniform with the school logo. Please ensure your child's name is in everything they bring to school so if it is lost, we can return it to them. PE Kit

Children are expected to wear appropriate clothing for PE.

Navy plain PE shorts

White T shirt (no buttons or accessories) either plain or with the Colton star on.

For indoor: black pumps or bare feet.

For outdoors: sturdy trainers, plain navy tracksuit top and bottoms (**not football / rugby strips**) Long hair must be tied back and no jewellery can be worn for PE sessions

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Hair

Hair should be neat and the child's natural colour. No extreme haircuts such as lines, patterns or shapes shaved into the hair. Hair must be at least grade 2 in length. Long hair (below shoulders) should be tied back. Decorative hair accessories should be small, discrete and in the school colours of navy, grey, black or white.

Appearance

Jewellery is not allowed in school with the exception of one small pair of stud earrings and a watch. Smart

No nail varnish or makeup is to be worn by our children. The exception to this is on PTA dress down or break the rules day and charity fancy dress days when face paints would be allowed (E.G. dots for Pudsey Bear).

Equipment

School will provide the equipment the children need for their learning.

Children in Year 5 and Year 6 are allowed to walk home from school themselves if we receive written permission from parents / carers. They can bring a mobile phone to school, but these cannot be used on the school playground. Phones must be handed in to the class teacher at the start of the day and they will be locked away for safe keeping until home time.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will need a 'book bag' to keep things safe between home and school. Children may bring a small bag or rucksack in Key Stage 2 to carry their things but are welcome to continue to use their book bag.

Water bottles

We encourage the children to drink water through the school day. Please ensure your child has a suitable water bottle. Stanley Cups are not suitable as they are far too big to store in the classroom and they hurt if dropped on little toes.
