Summary of activities

Discussion with Mrs Johnson about teaching / learning and the curriculum. Also discussed subject leader development (Deep dive prep).

What I learned as a result of my visit

Well done to Mrs Johnson on the Mental Health First Aid Mark- well deserved and I am sure it will be extremely valuable to school in the future to support mental health awareness.

School are continuing to trial their 'Curriculum for Life'. Plan to review and refine next academic year.

Main aspects are to be:

Digitally Literate

Effective Communicators

Good citizens - Global & Local

Appreciative of the Arts

Self-Aware

Environmentally aware and understand sustainability.

School's ethos – 'Everyone Successful Everyday' - continues to run through everything school is trying to achieve.

The revised schemes of work reflect the local area, particularly in history and geography – for example Armley Mills, Roman influence in Leeds and the significance of Whitkirk Church and the Barnbow Lasses in WW2.

Links made between art / music and history – for example William Morris is studied alongside the Victorians.

Bespoke training from Bryony Turford on subject leadership and curriculum development – 5 sessions – January to June. Bryony is the Senior Regional Hub Leader, Yorkshire & The Humber for Primary Science Mark and a Chartered Science Teacher (CSciTeach). She also works with Manchester University.

Positive comments about the focus

The new curriculum reflects the needs of the children and supports the children to develop an understanding of their locality.

Staff feel their development is a priority and the course has increased their understanding of how to lead a curriculum subject.

Aspects I would like clarified / questions I have

I would like to see how the children present their learning and how the curriculum is put into practise in the classroom. If the curriculum has needed narrowing as a result of trying to catch up as a result of Covid lockdowns, which subjects have been prioritised. What has been removed? Caroline will give me some possible dates for an in-person visit to school after the Spring bank break.

Ideas for future visits

I would like to look at some samples of learning and books and maybe talk to some children about their work – once it is safe to visit school. Date TBC.

Possible joint book scrutiny with Caroline and other governors to quality assure judgments and share best practise with non-teaching governors?

Could we hear from the school council – about their return to school post covid etc?
